

After School Program Spring Enrichment Classes

OVERVIEW

Spring enrichment classes will begin during the week of Monday, April 7th and end during the week of Monday, May 12th. These classes are open to all Emerson students. All classes will take place during after school hours with each class meeting once a week for one hour and beginning no earlier than 3:00pm. All of our enrichment courses are taught by Emerson teachers, parents, and some *Summer at Emerson* and After School Program staff members.

REGISTRATION

All families who wish to register for an enrichment class must sign up via our <u>SignUp Genius link</u>. Grade level requirements are firmly set for each class and will not be modified. Please note that these spots are available on a first come, first served basis. We thank you in advance for understanding.

COMMUNICATION

There will likely be email communications sent throughout the session regarding any class updates or changes. The email address used to register your child for classes is the one we will use to send out these communications. CANCELLATION POLICY

If a class meeting is canceled for any reason (instructor absence, weather, etc), we will do our best to schedule a make-up date. This make-up meeting would occur on the same day and time that the class normally would meet during a given week. This rescheduling will depend on the school calendar and the instructor's availability. If a make-up meeting is not possible, we will prorate the total cost of the class at the end of the session to account for the missed class meeting.

PAYMENT

Our regular class prices range from \$169 to \$332, as noted in the class descriptions. Classes that do not meet the minimum enrollment will be canceled; you will be notified via email and your account will not be charged. Each class fee covers all associated costs and will be billed to your account at the end of May. **Refunds are not given for missed classes or mid-session withdrawals**.

CLASS PICK-UP PROCEDURE

When you arrive to pick up your child, please sign them out with your Procare PIN at the front of the library. We ask that you then wait in our Belonging Center as the area around our after school desk tends to get crowded when classes let out at the same time. All students will walk down to the Belonging Center to connect with their parent or guardian once their class has ended. Certain class meetings might occasionally run a few minutes over their allotted time. We appreciate your patience during these times. If you need to get your student from their class early, you are welcome to walk to their class location and retrieve them.
